New ratings across all boat types this year were equal to last year and higher than 2022. This indicates high utilization of our education system.



Volunteer Interest Groups


CBI continued to have two longstanding volunteer interest groups and added one new interest group as of the end of the 2024 season. Between Tiller Club, and Women's Sailing and Racing there were a total of 888 sign-outs, serving 184 unique people. We are excited to welcome High-Performance Racing as a new volunteer interest group and look forward to collaborating with them over the winter to prepare for the 2025 season.

Junior Program Metrics

Junior Program Memberships

In 2024, we had a total of 919 Junior Program memberships, a decrease from previous years. However, we also served 119 additional children through field trips this year, bringing the total number of kids served to 1,038, which aligns more closely with prior years. Notably, we saw an increase in sliding scale memberships, reaching 35.4% (325) in 2024, compared to 31.2% (315) in 2023, and 26.7% (281) in 2022.

Junior Program Fleet Utilization

Sign-outs declined alongside the drop in Junior Program memberships with fewer juniors enrolled in beginning sailing, a 2-week class accounting for about 700 sign-outs. However, high-performance sign-outs increased. The introduction of the Intro to Racing class led to greater usage of our 420 fleet and sparked more interest in 420 racing.

Fleet and Facilities

Major Projects

<u>420 Mast Head Floats:</u> To enhance safety and reduce damage during capsizing, the 420 fleet received Hobie Cat-rated mast head floats. This upgrade has eliminated the risk of "turtling," minimized damage during capsizes, improved safety standards, sped up capsize recovery times, and decreased wear on the fleet, boosting overall operational efficiency

<u>Cape Cod Mercury Tillers:</u> 100 new tiller handles were produced from marine-grade Ash lumber. These durable tillers will maximize the lifespan of the rudder handles and enhance operational capacity for our fleet.

Norton 18 Coach Boat: Our 55-year-old Norton 18 coach boat underwent a complete deck and system overhaul due to deteriorated, waterlogged decking and stringers. We replaced these with lightweight, waterproof Cousa boards, which have a 50-year lifespan. The new deck was fiberglassed, gel-coated, and equipped with non-skid surfaces for enhanced safety. Additional upgrades included rewiring the internal bilge pump and motor controls, installing new navigation lights and electronic systems, and modernizing the control board.

<u>Sonars 3 & 6:</u> During its lay-up season, Sonar 6 received scheduled maintenance, including hull sanding, fairing, repainting, and keel repairs, ensuring optimal condition for future use. Meanwhile, Sonar 3 had its deck repaired by replacing rotted stringers with custom-trimmed marine-grade, pressure-treated 2x4 lumber, restoring the deck's integrity for safe operation.

<u>Picnic Tables:</u> Eight new picnic tables were built and installed from pressure-treated lumber, stained for durability and appearance. These tables will enhance the outdoor experience for community members and visitors alike.

<u>Tripp 3 Repower:</u> Tripp 3 was repowered with a Yanmar JH40 turbo diesel engine, offering advantages over its gasoline predecessor, including superior fuel efficiency, durability, and torque—ideal for towing and recovery operations. With a projected lifespan of 20,000 hours with proper maintenance, the diesel engine's lower flammability also enhances safety in maritime environments. This upgrade will yield long-term savings and operational reliability for safety and maintenance tasks.
